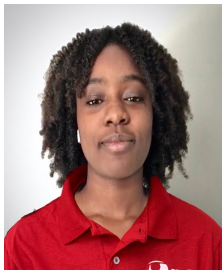
Kate Dantagnan: Archbishop Chapelle High School
